#### **These are Challenging Times**

These are challenging times. First the good news, with the establishment of the 2003 District Budget by the Board of Directors, the Department for Outreach is pleased to be able to report that it will be able to provide support to financially assisted congregations and missions at the levels it communicated to them in December of last year. The Department thanks the congregations of our East District for their continued support that makes it possible to assist newly established missions and financially struggling congregations in our District.

Now the bad news. The level funding allocated to the Department for this year has once again been decreased to the point that one would need to go back to 1981 to arrive at a lower level. The Department was allocated \$415,044 from congregational offerings for 2003. We are grateful that an additional \$61,956 was available from special grants and gifts some of which will be depleted this year, which brings the total to \$477,000.


**T**o put this situation into perspective, in 1981 the Department received \$392,000. What makes this reality "challenging" is the fact that it would take \$780,750 in 2002 dollars to equal the purchasing power of the \$392,000 from 1978. In other words the Department has fifty cents in 2003 for every dollar it was provided in 1981 to carry out its work.

#### ANNOUNCEMENT

I am happy to inform you that on March 2, 2003, the congregation of **Holy Trinity Church** voted in favour of joining in membership with the East District of Lutheran Church–Canada. I am also happy to say that the vote was not divisive, in fact, 90% of the membership voted in favour.

I have sent a letter to Rev. Krueger indicating our desire to leave the SELC-LCMS and I have attached a signed copy of the resolution provided us by Konstantin Hahn. I will forward you a copy of the approved and signed resolution next week.

On behalf of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, I would like to thank you for all your assistance and we look forward to our future relationship with LCC.



 $\mathbf{W}$ hat this means is that financially assisted ministries have their support reduced to the level where they barely are able to function. Funding is sufficient to cover only the bare essentials such as salaries and utilities. Virtually nothing is available for carrying on an energetic ministry that requires materials of any kind. That is to say nothing about the prospects for starting new missions in our teeming urban centres, the expanding of currently started work that is only partially supported as for example, Sherbrooke or the filling of some vacancies such as Sauveur Vivant, Gatineau that has been without a pastor for over a year. Unless this trend is reversed, sheer necessity, quite apart from good stewardship in some instances, will continue to dictate the formation of partnerships between struggling neighbouring congregations whether they are currently assisted or self-supporting.

# **Spring Voter's Meetings**

The purpose for drawing this matter to your attention at this time is two fold: first of all, simply to keep you informed. Secondly, to assist our congregations to prepare themselves for the up coming District convention. Please discuss in your **spring voters' meetings** the implications of the steadily declining support for the mission and support of struggling congregations that we are endeavoring to carry out together and what your congregation plans are, that would either reverse or continue this trend. While congregational delegates may not be bound by their congregations with regard to their voting, delegates are far better equipped to vote intelligently on issues before the convention when they know the thinking of their members.
